Our society has made giant strides these past few years, and we owe it all to you --- our faithful supporters and volunteers. A special thanks to all!!!



They showed various New Knoxville locations and Bruce interviewing the late Deloris Fischbach. We hope to share this film in its entirety with the community later this year. We'll keep you informed.

A NEW BOOK ABOUT LADBERGEN

Dr. Dean Hoge has written a new book entitled From Ladbergen to America: The Heritage and the Migration. It begins with an outline of the history of Ladbergen and its surroundings, then presents thirty short essays on the history. In the second part it has a summary translation of a good German book on immigrants who came to Minster, New Bremen, and New Knoxville. The book's last part is a series of jokes and stories translated from Low German.

The book is 260 pages, with 100 pictures and 10 maps. The cover was illustrated by local artist Pat Wietholter. It was written to explain the heritage to descendants of Ladbergen immigrants. This is a "must have" book. We will have this book available at our Heritage Center and our Community Library very soon.


